What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we may not craftily seek to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, nor obtain it by a show of right, but help and be of service to him in keeping it.

STIR UP, we beseech Thee, Thy power, O Lord, and come, that by Thy protection we may be rescued from the threatening perils of our sins and saved by Thy mighty deliverance. **Amen.**

Catechism: The Close of the Commandments

[Review all Commandments and Closing & their meanings.]

What does God say of all these Commandments?

He says thus: I the Lord, thy God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquities of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate Me, and showing mercy unto thousands of them that love Me and keep My commandments.

Scripture:

1 John 1:8-9 - "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. [*If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.*"]

[Review all Commandments and Closing & their meanings.]

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all that transgress these Commandments. Therefore we should fear His wrath, and not act contrary to them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all that keep these Commandments. Therefore we should also love and trust in Him, and willingly do according to His Commandments.

Scripture:

Ecclesiastes 7:20 - "There is not a just man on earth who does good and does not sin."

Kernlied: "From Heaven Above to Earth I Come" (LSB 358)

Catechism: The First Article of the Apostles' Creed (review: Baptism 4)

O LORD, we beseech Thee favorably to hear the prayers of Thy people that we, who are justly punished for our offenses, may be mercifully delivered by Thy goodness, for the glory of Thy name; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. **Amen.**

Catechism: The Second Article of the Apostles' Creed (review: Keys)

2nd – And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived of the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead.
